Following the 2020 census, Arizona redrew its maps to meet the new population calculations. This means that your Congressional and Legislative Districts have likely changed, and, in some cases, incumbents will be running against one another.

# WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR POLLING PLACE

Every qualified voter is required to show proof of identity at the polling place before receiving a ballot. Acceptable forms of identification with photograph, name and address of the voter (one required):

- Valid Arizona driver's license
- Valid Arizona non-operating identification license
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Valid U.S. federal, state or local governmentissued identification

# Acceptable forms of identification without a photograph (two required):

- Utility bill that is dated within 90 days of the date of the election
- Bank or credit union statement that is dated within 90 days of the election
- · Valid Arizona vehicle registration

- Indian census card
- Property tax statement of the elector's residence
- Vehicle insurance card
- Valid U.S. federal, state or local governmentissued identification, including a voter registration card issued by the County Recorder
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Recorder's Certificate
- Any mailing to the elector marked "Official Election Material"







Ten ballot measures will appear on Arizona's General Election ballot. Below is a synopsis of each ballot measure.

#### PROPOSITION 128: VOTER PROTECTION ACT; COURT DETERMINATIONS

The Arizona Constitution prohibits the Arizona State Legislature from amending voter-approved laws, except when the change "furthers the purpose" of the measure and receives a three-fourths super majority vote of the Legislature. Prop 128 would allow the Legislature to amend or supersede voterapproved ballot initiatives if any portion has been declared unconstitutional or invalid by the Arizona Supreme Court or U.S. Supreme Court. The Legislature's changes can be effective on a simple majority vote and do not require the changes to further the purpose of the initiative.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote allows the Legislature to amend or repeal previously approved ballot initiatives should any portion be declared unconstitutional by the Arizona State Supreme Court or the U.S. Supreme Court.

NO: A "NO" vote rejects the proposed amendment.

#### PROPOSITION 129: INITIATIVES; SINGLE SUBJECT; TITLE

Proposition 129 amends the Arizona State Constitution to require citizen-initiated ballot measures to address a single subject and matters properly connected to that subject. This amendment would also require the initiative's subject to be explicitly expressed in the ballot title, and any portion of the initiative not expressed in the title would be void.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote requires that citizen-initiated ballot measures must embrace a single subject.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote opposes the constitutional amendment thereby continuing to allow citizen-initiated ballot measures to have more than one subject line.

#### **PROPOSITION 130: PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS**

The Arizona Constitution prescribes 13 exemptions for property taxes in four separate sections of the constitution and prescribes the specific value for some of those exemptions. Proposition 130 would consolidate those exemptions into one section and authorizes the Arizona State Legislature to set qualifications and the values for those exemptions that are not full exemptions. The Legislature passed a companion measure that, if Prop 130 passes, would set those exemptions at the levels adjusted for inflation to 2022.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote consolidates the constitution's property tax exemption provisions into a single section and authorizes the Legislature to set the values and qualifications for certain property tax exemptions.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote retains the current status of property tax exemptions prescribed in the constitution.

# PROPOSITION 131: LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR; JOINT TICKET

Proposition 131 establishes the position of Lieutenant Governor within the Executive Department and authorizes the Arizona State Legislature to establish the duties of the Lieutenant Governor. Additionally, the Lieutenant Governor would be elected on a joint ticket with the Governor and would succeed to Governor in the event the Governor resigns, dies, is removed from office or is permanently unable to perform the duties of the office. The measure also removes the requirement that an official in the line of succession (i.e., Secretary of State, Attorney General, Treasurer) be skipped if that official had been appointed rather than elected to the office. Currently, the Secretary of State, or the next elected official in the line, succeeds to Governor when a vacancy occurs.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote establishes the position of Lieutenant Governor who would be elected on the ticket with the Governor and who would succeed the Governor in the case of vacancy. It would have the effect also of enacting a legislative measure that requires the Governor to appoint the Lt. Governor as Chief of Staff, Director of the Department of Administration or any other position for which the Governor is authorized to make an appointment.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote rejects the establishment of the Lt. Governor position and retains the current line of succession structure.

### PROPOSITION 132: INITIATIVES; SUPERMAJORITY VOTE; REQUIREMENT

Proposition 132 amends the Arizona Constitution to require that any initiative, referendum or proposed constitutional amendment to approve a tax would require a 60% super majority of votes cast to pass. All other initiatives, referendums and constitutional amendments would continue to require a simple majority for approval.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote supports the constitutional amendment to require a 60% majority for voters to pass ballot measures to approve tax increases.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote maintains the current requirement of a simple majority vote for all ballot measures.

# PROPOSITION 209: PREDATORY DEBT COLLECTION PROTECTION ACT

Proposition 209 reduces the portion of a debtor's weekly disposable income subject to debt collection actions from 25% to 10% or 5% if the court determines that would be an extreme hardship during garnishment actions. It also increases the debt collection exemptions for a debtor's home (\$250,000 to \$400,000), household furnishings (\$6,000 to \$15,000), vehicle (\$6,000 to \$15,000 or, if the debtor has a physical disability, \$12,000 to \$25,000), and single financial account (\$300 to \$5,000). The measure would also reduce the maximum interest rate on medical debts from 10% (or the amount specified in a written contract) to the lesser of 3% or an annual rate equal to the weekly average rate of a one-year treasury yield for the week prior to the first bill provided to the consumer.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote approves the lower amounts of a consumer's income that may be subject to debt collection actions, the increased exemptions for the value of a debtor's property that is subject to debt collection, and the lower interest rate that may be charged on medical debts.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote retains the current limits on income and property subject to debt collection actions, as well as the current interest cap on medical debts.

# **PROPOSITION 211: VOTERS' RIGHT TO KNOW ACT**

Proposition 211 makes numerous changes to Arizona's campaign finance laws. The measure would require that entities that spend more than \$50,000 on statewide or \$25,000 on other candidate campaign media in a two-year election cycle disclose the sources and intermediaries of the entities' funds. The measure also requires various other disclosures of persons who are involved in the entity.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote approves the additional disclosure of campaign spending.

NO: A "NO" vote rejects the proposed changes.

#### PROPOSITION 308: TUITION; POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

Proposition 308 allows a non-citizen student to be eligible for in-state college tuition status when the student (a) attended school while physically present in Arizona for at least two years and (b) graduated from a public, private or home school, or obtained a high school equivalency diploma, while physically present in the state of Arizona. Presently, Arizona high school graduates who do not possess lawful immigration status are denied in-state tuition status. Prop 308 would also exclude post-secondary education from the list of public benefits that are denied residents without lawful immigration status.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote would make students eligible for in-state college tuition status if the student (a) attended school while physically present in Arizona for at least two years and (b) graduated from a public, private or home school, or obtained a high school equivalency diploma, while physically present in the state of Arizona.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote continues to deny in-state tuition status to Arizona resident high school graduates who do not possess lawful immigration status.

#### PROPOSITION 309: VOTER IDENTIFICATION; AFFIDAVIT; PROCEDURE

Proposition 309 would add additional requirements for Arizona citizens who cast mail-in ballots and change voter ID requirements for in-person voters. For in-person voting, a voter would be required to show a valid driver's license, non-operating ID, tribal enrollment card or ID, or U.S. governmentissued ID with the same name and address that appears on the voting precinct register. The voter may alternatively present valid photo ID that does not have matching address if the ID is accompanied by an additional document that has the matching name and address on the precinct register, such as a utility bill, bank statement, property tax statement or any government-issued mailing labeled "official election material." Prop 309 would also require an early ballot and return envelope to be able to conceal the early ballot affidavit when mailed or delivered and requires the voter to provide the early voter ID number, date of birth and signature. The measure also specifies that the Department of Transportation may not charge a fee to issue a non-operating ID if the applicant attests that ID is sought in order to comply with the proposed voter ID requirements.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote approves the two options for presenting identification for in-person voting and approves early ballot affidavit requirements.

**NO:** A **"NO"** vote retains the current standards for in-person voter identification and early ballot signature requirements.

### PROPOSITION 310: FIRE DISTRICTS; FUNDING; TPT INCREMENT

Proposition 310 would establish a 0.1% sales tax for the next 20 years, January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2042. Revenues from the statewide tax would be distributed to fire districts, which are special districts separate from city or town fire departments, that provide fire and emergency response to rural, generally unincorporated areas.

**YES:** A **"YES"** vote supports the constitutional amendment and thereby establishes a statewide 0.1% sales tax for 20 years to provide additional funding for the state's rural fire districts.

NO: A "NO" vote rejects the proposed tax.

#### NOTE

To be counted, early ballots must be received by the elections department of the county in which the voter resides no later than 7 p.m. the day of the election.
